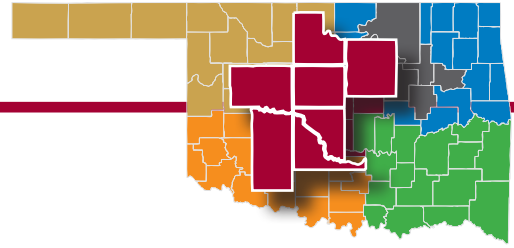
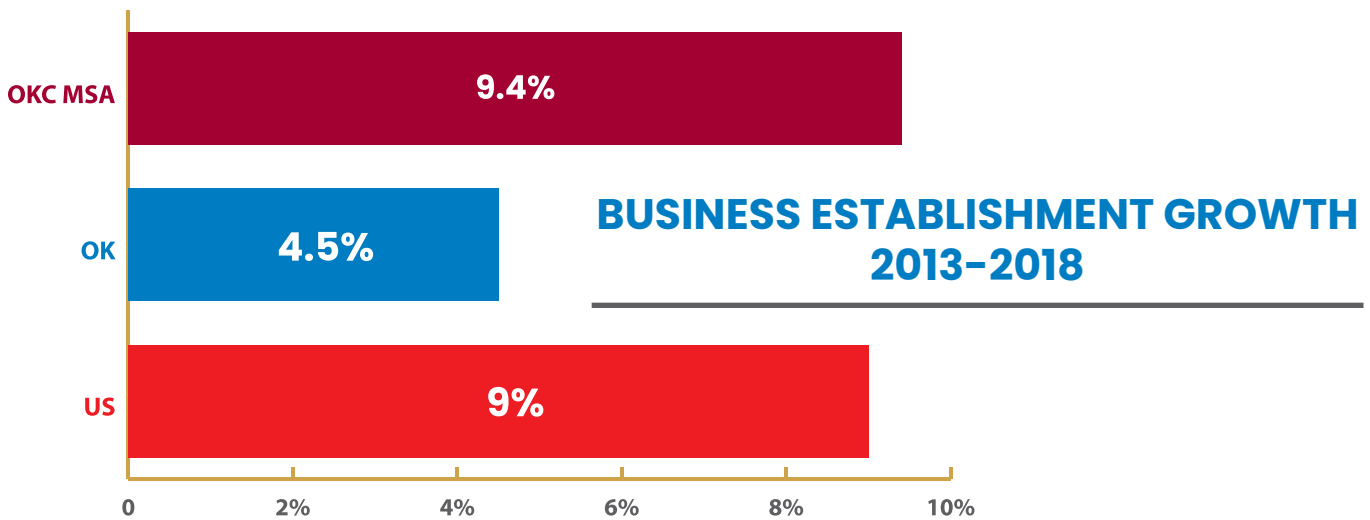


OKLAHOMA CITY MSA



The OKC MSA made up 35.4% of Oklahoma’s total population in 2018, while making up 41.4% of the state’s total GDP. The OKC MSA saw a net migration increase of 5.8% between 2010 and 2018, which was the highest increase out of all regions in the state, as well as a 6.5% increase in the total employment in the area between 2013 and 2018, which was the highest of the regions as well.

Although the OKC MSA, as well as every region, had a negative change in the labor force participation rate between 2012 and 2017, the OKC MSA’s change was the lowest of the six regions. The following tables detail different metrics at the national, state and local level.



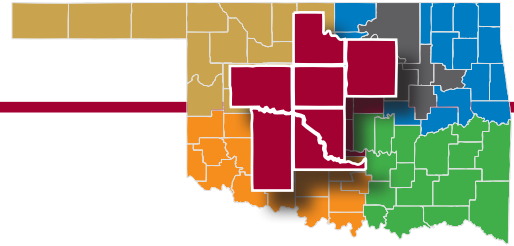

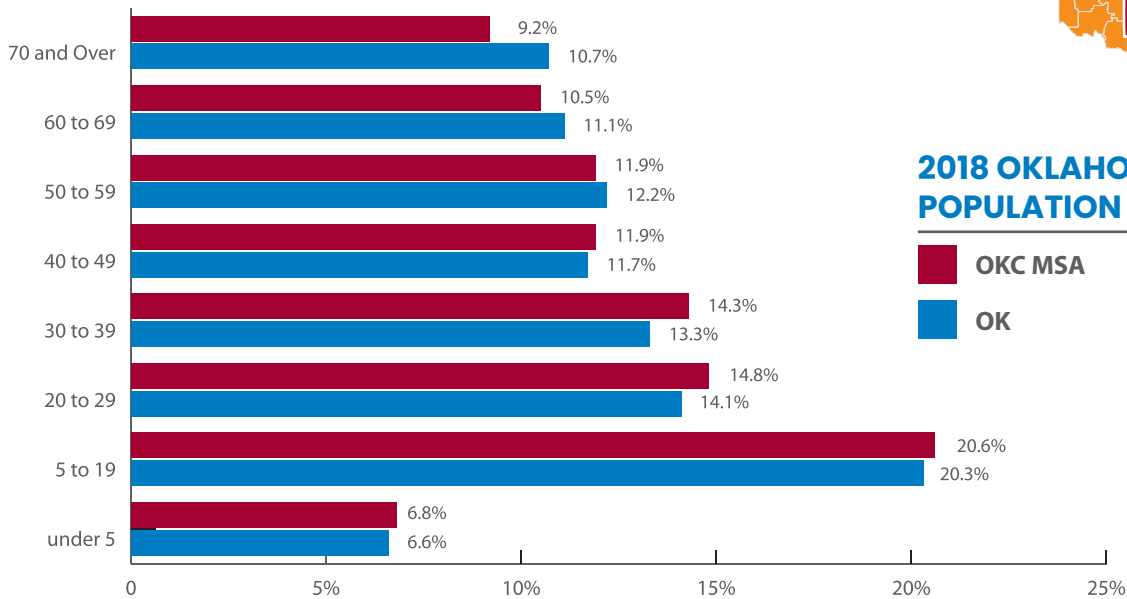

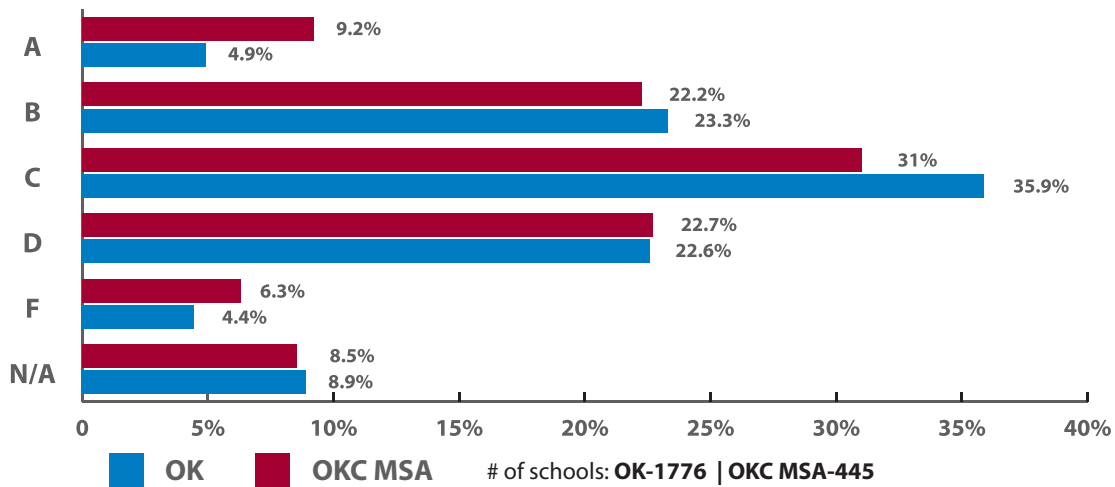
