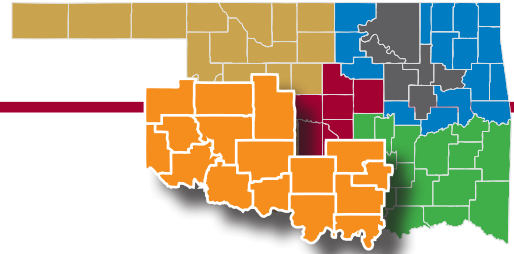
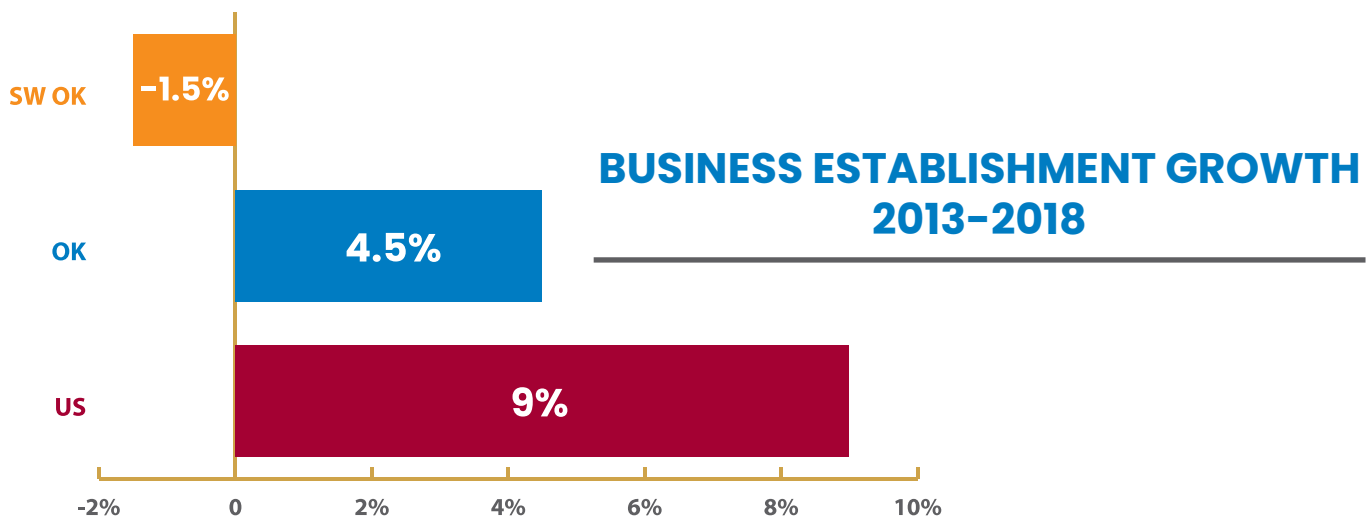


SOUTHWESTERN OKLAHOMA



Southwestern Oklahoma made up 9.8% of Oklahoma’s population while making up 8.7% of the state’s total GDP. The Southwest region is no stranger to net migration loss, and between 2010 and 2018, the Southwest region had a negative net migration loss of population of 5%. Out of all regions in the state, this was the largest decrease, with the Northwest region having the second largest decrease at -3.7%

Although the percentage of individuals with bachelor’s degrees or higher in the Southwest region is the second lowest in the state, the percent change between 2012 and 2017 of individuals with bachelor’s degrees or higher was tied for second compared to the other regions statewide. The following tables detail different metrics at the national, state, and local level.

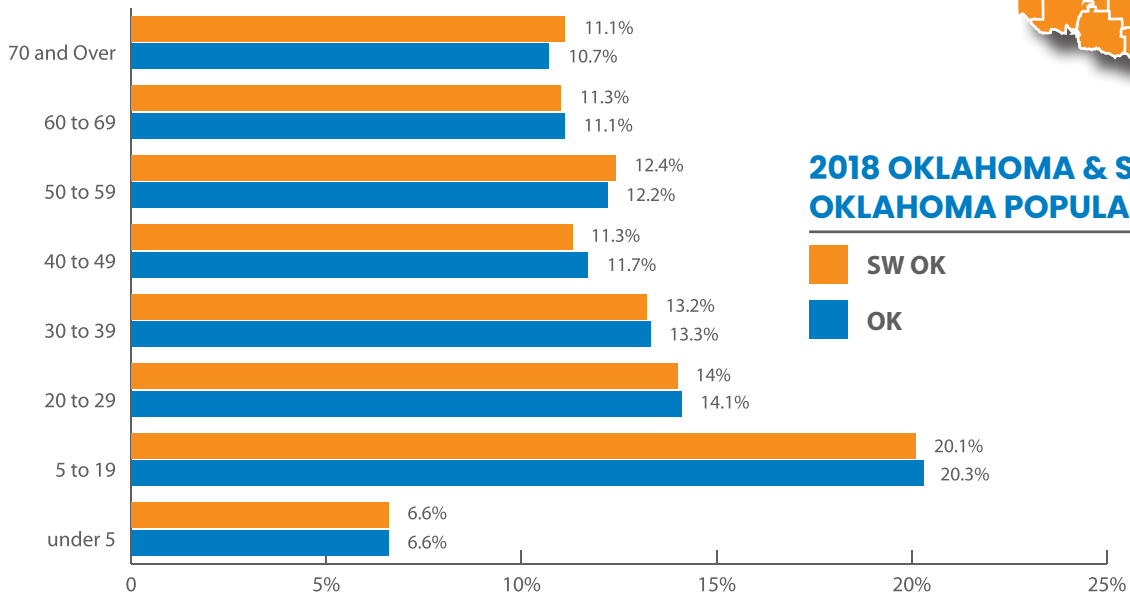
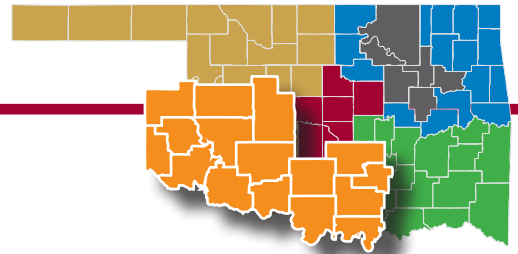

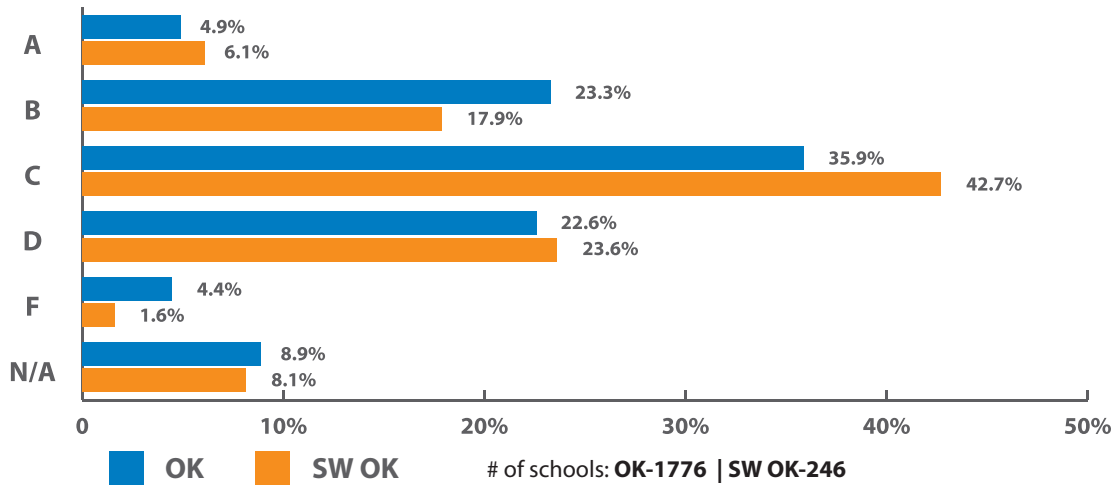
2018 Unemployment Rate
