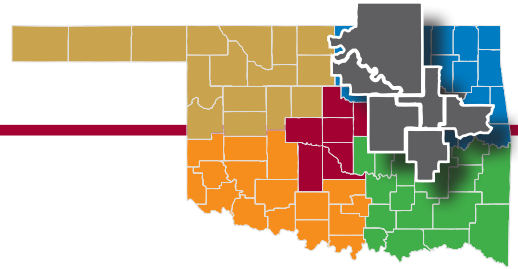
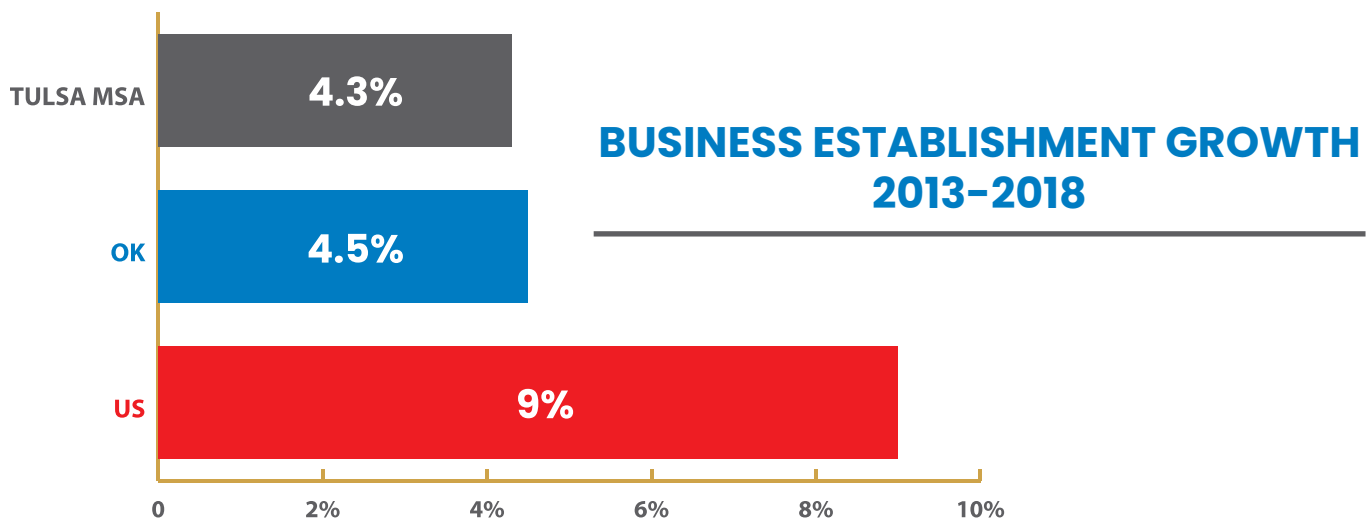


TULSA MSA



The Tulsa MSA made up 25.2% of Oklahoma’s total population in 2018, while making up 28.2% of the state’s total GDP. The Tulsa MSA saw a net migration increase of 2.3% between 2010 and 2018, which was the second highest increase in the state. Total employment increased by 6% in the area between 2013 and 2018, which was also the second highest increase in the state.

Although the unemployment rate in the Tulsa MSA was the third highest in the state, it had the third largest decrease between 2013 and 2018. The following tables detail different metrics at the national, state and local level.



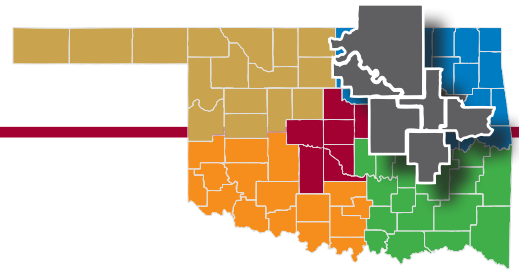

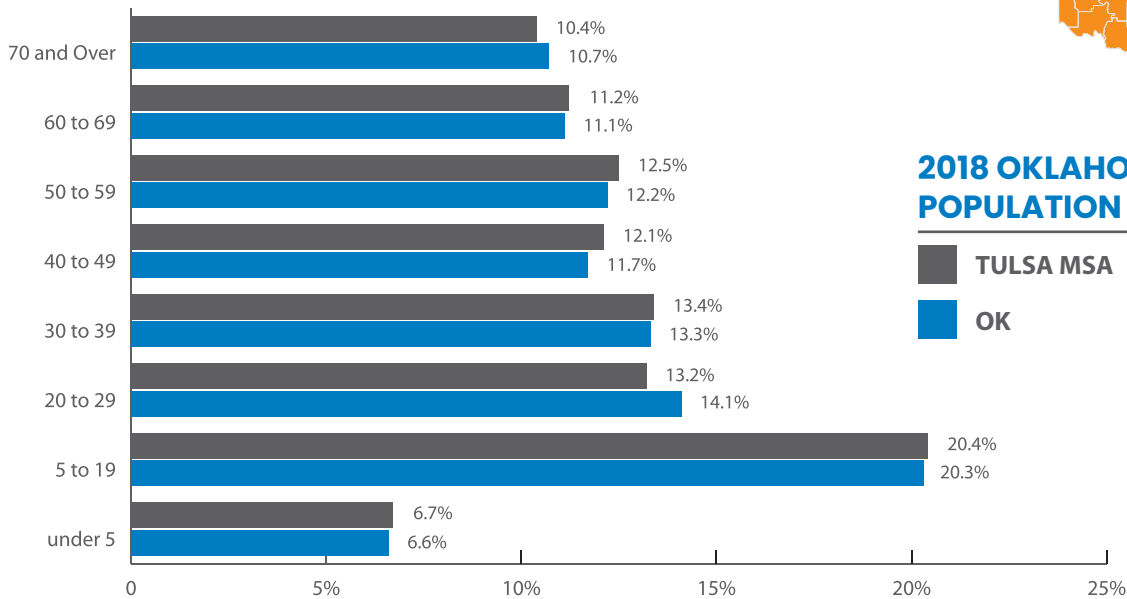

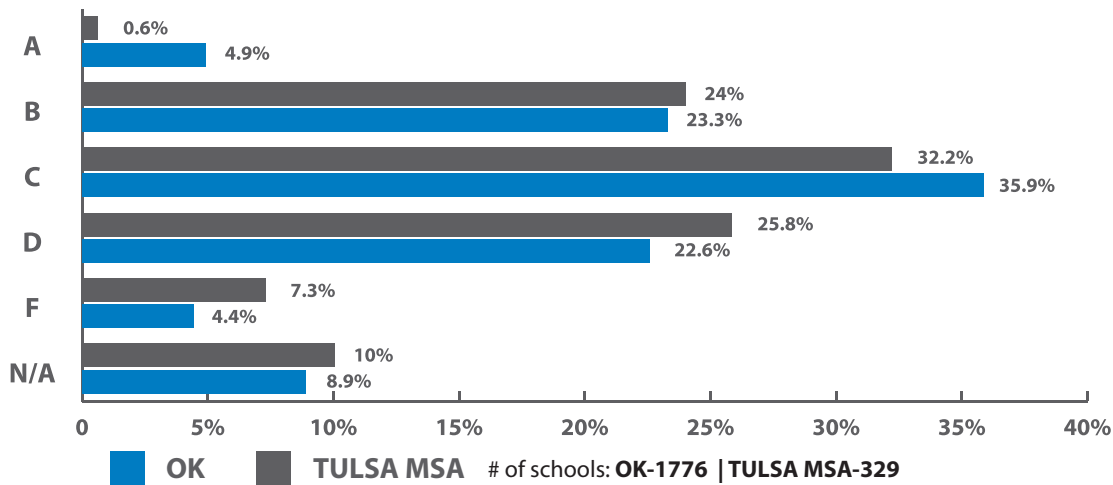
